

Crime In North Carolina - 2013

Annual Summary Report of 2013 Uniform Crime Reporting Data¹

North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation

The rate per 100,000 people of Crime Index offenses reported to law enforcement agencies throughout North Carolina decreased 7.0 percent during 2013 when compared to the figures reported in 2012.

The rate of violent crime (which includes murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) decreased 5.4 percent statewide. Individually, the murder rate decreased 3.8 percent, the rape rate decreased 10.2 percent, the robbery rate decreased 1.9 percent, and the aggravated assault rate decreased 6.4 percent.

The rate of property crime (which consists of burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft) decreased 7.2 percent across the state. The rate for burglary decreased 9.3 percent and larceny decreased 5.9 percent. The motor vehicle theft rate decreased 10.9 percent. A property crime not included with the other Index offenses, the arson rate decreased 17.7 percent.

For Crime Index offenses, the number of juveniles under the age of 18 arrested declined 11 percent in 2013, while adults arrested for Crime Index offenses decreased 5%. For violent crime, juveniles under the age of 18 arrested increased 1 percent, while adult arrests decreased 8 percent. For property crime, the number of juveniles under 18 arrested declined 13 percent, while adult arrests decreased 3 percent.

²The crime rate is defined as the number of offenses per 100,000 population. It is derived by first dividing a jurisdiction's population by 100,000 and then dividing the number of offenses by the resulting figure. The population figures used to calculate population coverage and crime rates are based on population data from the North Carolina Office of State Budget, Planning and Management.

³OFFENSE DEFINITIONS

The Crime Index includes the total number of murders, rapes, robberies, aggravated assaults, burglaries, larcenies, and motor vehicle thefts. While arson is considered an Index Crime, the number of arsons is not included in the Crime Index tables.

Violent Crime includes the offenses of murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault as defined below.

Murder - The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Forcible Rape - The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force are also included.

Robbery - The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence, and/or by putting the victim in fear.

Aggravated Assault - An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury. This type of assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or other means likely to produce death or serious bodily harm. Includes attempted assaults.

Property Crime includes the offenses of burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft as defined below.

Burglary - The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or theft. Includes attempted forcible entry.

Larceny - The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another.

Motor Vehicle Theft - The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

Arson - Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without the intent to defraud.

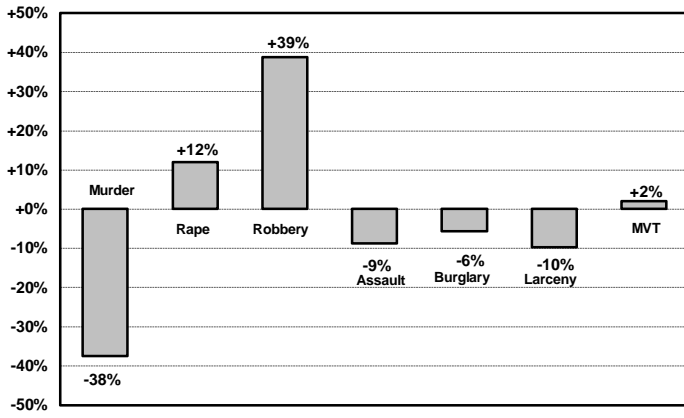

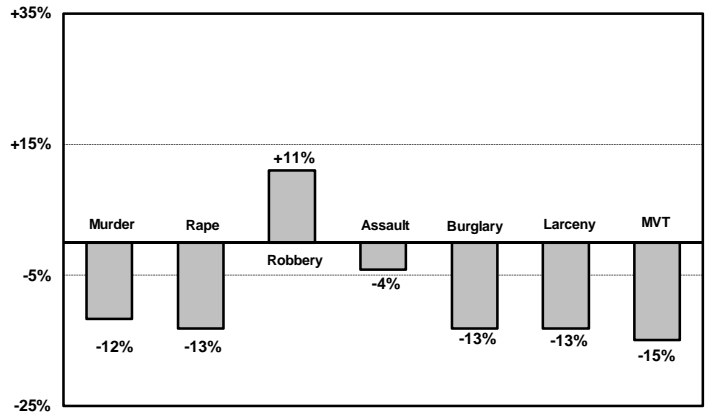
Juveniles Arrested for Index Crime

Juveniles Under 16



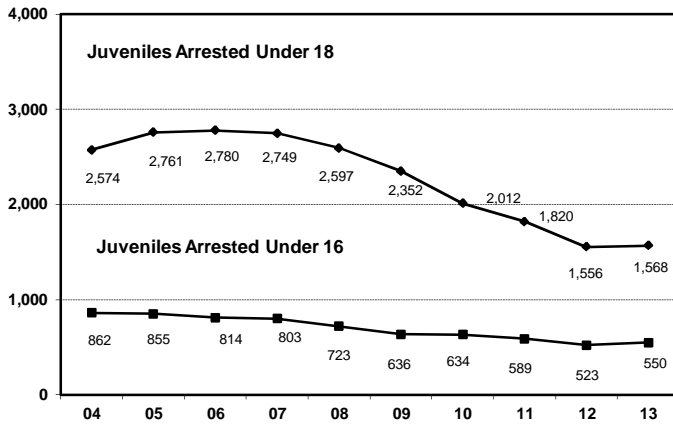

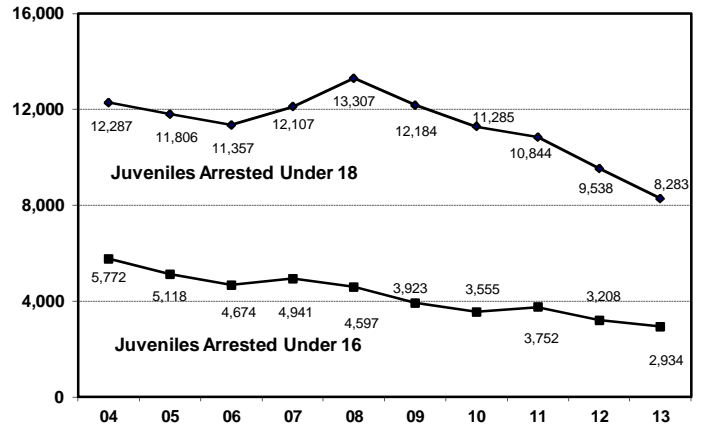

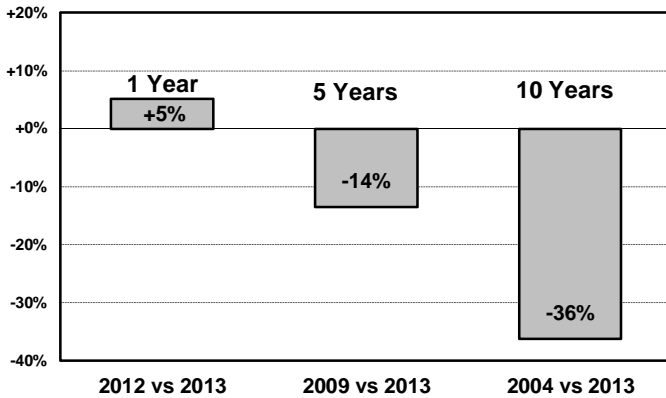

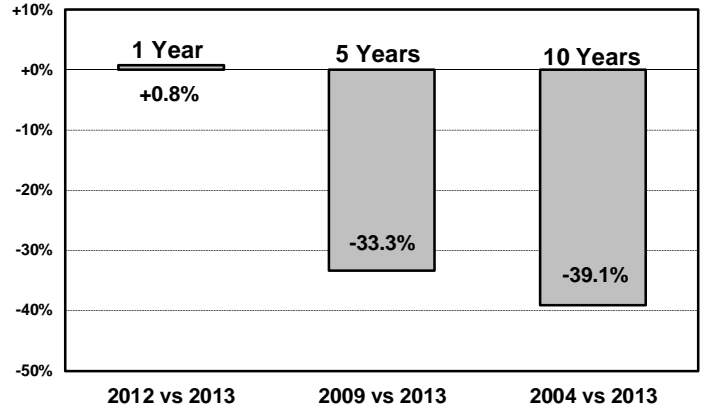
